

STANDARDS OF CONTINUING MEDICAL EDUCATION

In each two year period, it is recommended that every member of the College participate in 100 hours of continuing medical education as herein provided.

1. Study credits will be allotted on a hour for hour basis for time spent
2. All credits allowed by any section of specialty practice will be allowed hour for hour.
3. Credits shall have an understandable relationship to the patter of practice of the member.
4. The 100 hours credit will be made up as follows:

I. Group Learning – a **minimum** of 50 hours

Any of the following activities qualify under this section:

- All scientific sessions of international, national and provincial conventions.
- University courses, lectures, seminars and district scientific meetings.
- MMA Section scientific meetings.
- Short-term residencies.
- Review sessions, courses, e.g. Mayo Foundation.
- Formal ward rounds, grand rounds, etc.
- Clinical path conferences.
- Peer review, e.g. area hospital standards, medical records, death review.

II. Independent Learning – 50 hours may be credited

Under this section credit may be claimed for learning carried out privately, including:

- Medical tapes.
- Reading of current medical literature.
- Teaching and preceptorship, e.g. includes that to allied health professions.
- CORE content review, journal self-evaluation, etc.
- Preparation of papers.
- Time spent in preparation for examination in your specialty.

III. Other acceptable programs are those which have met CME requirements, or recertification by a certifying body, association, college, etc., which is accepted by this College for that purpose.

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A guideline is practice generally recommended.

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
